REIBA IAUARETÊ- BRASIL

December 5: Conclusion of the 2023 Parish Pastoral Evaluation. Communities and pastoral groups received a questionnaire prompting them to reflect, assess, and respond, which was then followed by sharing together. Volunteer Luciana participated as an advisor for the Children's Pastoral Group. At the end, the parish priest, Father Wellington, summarized the ideas and proposals for Saint Michael the Archangel Parish in the upcoming year.



December 17: Thanksgiving Mass celebrating the completion of early childhood, primary, and secondary education for students from the Middle Ualpés region in the Nova Esperança community. After the celebration, the four high school graduates presented their final work in Tukano about some of their ethnic mythology.



December 18: Presentation of the student certificates. There was a blessing ceremony for the high school graduates. One student also performed a song in the indigenous language. Afterwards, there was a celebration which included traditional dances.









REIBA SARRAPIA (PUEBLO NUEVO) - COLOMBIA

December 1: The Piaroa community collectively builds a house that will serve to support the community.









December 3: From November 21 to December 3, Sisters Celeste and Josefina visited Sister Cynthia, a REIBA volunteer in Pueblo Nuevo. There, they shared and appreciated the work that has been happening in support of Intercultural Bilingual Education (IBE).



December 8: The Piaroa community in Pueblo Nuevo celebrates the traditional Night of the Little Candles. During this gathering, volunteer Sister Cynthia hands out participation certificates from the Thematic Formational Sessions (EFTs) to the communities of Pueblo Nuevo, Atana, and Cotsibo.





REIBA AISHALTON- GUYANA

December 4-14: We celebrated the sacrament of confirmation in 6 different communities after a 4 year wait! Bishop Francis Alleyne visited the Rupununi region for 10 days, during which he confirmed 230 young people and adults. Each community welcomed him and our team warmly with songs, dances, and speeches.







December 17-19: End-of-term reflection workshop for the nursery and primary school teachers in the bilingual program. The team and teachers spent 3 days together reviewing lesson plans, presenting term reports, and analyzing their experiences over these last three months. During the time for self-reflection, teachers shared the challenges, joys, and blessings they experienced in their classes. Everyone expressed their gratitude for the fruitful discussion space, the support they are receiving, and for the work the bilingual program is doing in the communities.





CENTRAL COORDINATION


December 19: Bogotá, Colombia. Father Pablo and Robby Ospina, Executive Secretary of the International Federation of Fe y Alegría, met at Bogotá airport to discuss possibilities of REIBA collaborating with Fe y Alegría in the upcoming year 2024. Robby Ospina was previously part of the REIBA executive commission and has been in his new position for a year.





December 19: Medellín, Colombia. Father Pablo had a lengthy and fruitful meeting with Sister Alba Teresa Cediel, MML, the Superior General of the Missionary Sisters of Mother Laura, and Sister Maritza, MML, Mission Counselor of their congregation. It was a conversation about the REIBA process and the the Lauritas missionaries' commitment in the Pan-Amazon region. It was a comforting conversation that created a lot of energy and optimism about the future of REIBA.

December 20-21: Lima, Peru. Father Pablo met with Father Pedro Hugges, one of the advisors for REPAM and CEAMA, with whom he shared about the process and vision of REIBA-REPAM. Father Pedro is also the coordinator of REPAM's Human Rights Nucleus, and he shared about the work this nucleus is carrying out in the Amazon region. Father Pedro has been a great mentor since the very start of these ecclesial organizations or movements like REPAM and CEAMA.









December 20th. Lima, Peru. At the prayer house of the Lauritas in Callao, Father Pablo had a fraternal day with the REIBA Volunteers, Sisters Kenia and Yomaris from the Congregation of the Daughters of Jesus, and the Missionaries of Mother Laura represented by Sister Ana María, the regional animator, and Nany, the secretary of the Popayán Province. In the morning, Father Pablo met with each of the Volunteers and also with the Lauritas Sisters. In the afternoon, they had a virtual meeting with Sister Carla and Sister Maruja, Lauritas missionaries who welcomed Kenia and Yomaris to the Wijint mission; with Sister Presentación, a Laurita missionary and provincial of the Popayán province; with Sister Graciela, the Mother General of the Daughters of Jesus; with Sonia, mission counselor; and with Lisette, coordinator of the REIBA Volunteer Program. It was a very comforting meeting full of gratitude shared between both religious congregations and REIBA for all that this intercongregational experience has meant and the way in which it was enriched by REIBA's involvement.


