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REIBA FATIMA MISSION - BOLIVIA

REIBA AISHALTON – GUYANA

Wapichan Regional Reading and Writing Graduation. On March 29, both students and tutors of the Wapichan classes, which are held in the South Rupununi, traveled to the village of **Sawariwau** for the first ever graduation ceremony. The ceremony recognized more than 100 graduates from 16 villages, ranging from elementary school students to the elderly.



The courses were open to all, but focused especially on nursery teachers who teach in the Wapichan territory, in order to better contextualize the learning of their students. Even REIBA volunteer Sydney Stewart graduated with a group of young people and nursery teachers from Aishalton.









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On **April 1**, **computer classes** began with 7th and 8th grade students.

In Aishalton, students in grades 7-9 only attend classes twice a week due to a lack of space and staffing at the school. On their days off, Sydney began basic computer classes with them to teach them typing skills and proficiency in Microsoft Word, seeking to develop skills they can use throughout their lives and education.



JWL/EFT Graduation. On April 2, the Aishalton team was visited by Fr. Martin Lenk, SJ, Provincial for the Jesuits in the Caribbean, and Fr. Edwin Anthony, SJ, superior of St. Ignatius Mission and JWL coordinator. We took advantage of this visit to celebrate the annual graduation of all those who completed courses with Jesuit Worldwide Learning through our center, as well as for those who had completed the second round of REIBA EFTs on the Ecological Calendar.





The graduation featured speeches by: **Toshao Timothy Williams** of Aishalton, St. Robert Bellarmine Parish Chairperson **Nita Rodrigues**, as well as the two visiting priests.

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There was also the presentation of the courses, the explanation of our latest **Ecological Calendar**; and, of course, the delivery of certificates. It was very rewarding to see all the students complete their coursework successfully. This was also one of the first public presentations of the Ecological Calendar by those who participated in its creation.

The moot was: "No school-age child should have a social media account." They won this first round, so they will represent region 9 at the national level along with the other regional teams.



d our end-of-term workshop for the **Quality Bilingual Education**

On Friday, **April 4th**, we held our end-of-term workshop for the **Quality Bilingual Education Program (OBEP)**, which aimed to reflect and discuss the successes and challenges experienced by teachers. We were also accompanied by the District Education Officer, **Ms. Natasha Poon**, who offered good ideas for our teachers.

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Finally, we had a presentation of our **Wapichan Calendar**, along with a brief training on how this tool can be incorporated into the classroom. It was presented by two teachers from other villages who participated in REIBA's EFTs, who also received their certificates.





The hope now is that all teachers in our program will take the calendar and its methodology to their respective schools to implement it.

REIBA SAINT ANTHONY OF LOMERIO -BOLIVIA

On Wednesday, April 2, teacher Juana Pocoena, teacher of the "June 13" Educational Unit, carried out the playful activity called: "The sale" with the children of 1st A of primary school. This class aimed to allow the young students to simulate the purchase/sale of products, but the innovative thing is that it was carried out using the native language **Bés+ro**. The children enjoyed the activity and at the same time learned new words.



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


On **Wednesday, May 30**, **teacher Luisa Suárez**, of initial level in San Antonio de Lomerío, led an activity suggested by Karina Sullón for the teaching and revitalization of the native language Bés+ro, which used singing to interact with the learners.

The children, who are between 4 and 5 years old, were able to have fun and learn how they can introduce themselves and greet their friends in the native language.

Also, **1A teacher Juana Pocoena** of the June 13th primary school taught **writing and pronunciation** so that the children can write and say **"my name is ..." in bés+ro.** He also taught them how their own names can sound different in the native language.









For her part, **teacher Petrona Guasace** of the 2nd year of primary school, following the same presentation strategy, incorporated the question **kar+k+?** or "What" in Bés+ro as well as "**and, you?**", to give more vocabulary to the children. These children are already a little older in relation to the other children participating in linguistic revitalization strategies.



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Likewise, 4th grade **teacher Carmen Pocoena** of the primary school implemented the strategy of greeting and introduction. Each person in turn incorporated the use of typical female clothing, the tipoy and the e'sao hat.

In the children's expressions you can see that they enjoy learning their native language and the teacher also expresses that despite some small attention difficulties, these activities can be a good strategy for linguistic revitalization.

Professor Ignacio Pocoena (Local Coordinator REIBA) together with some professors from the June 13th Educational Unit who are part of the group that studies Design of IBE materials in the EFTs, were carrying out the research work to discover the phonemes from highest to lowest incidence in the native language bés+ro.

They have also managed to graph the vocabulary they have based on the native alphabet.

Little by little, the work of linguistic revitalization together with the design of materials will bear fruit in the new generations of **Monkox Chiquitana**.

May God continue to enlighten the teachers of the June 13th Educational Unit who carry out the REIBA mission in the territory.

REIBA DICARO - ECUADOR

First anniversary of the departure of **Sr. Rosa Alejandro, MML.** On **March 29,** a year after her death, a group of us visited the house of Sr. Rosita's father. A group of Waorani women from Dicaro, Sr. Marlene and REIBA volunteers arrived in Lago Agrio at the house of her parents (already very old) where her siblings were also present to participate in the day's activities.

We celebrated the Mass presided over by Bishop Adalberto Jiménez which was very heartfelt. We were filled with hope remembering the legacy that Sr. Rosita left behind, like the Women's House project for which she fought with so much effort. We also remember her affection and defense of the pikenanis (elderly Waorani men and women), her concern for higher education in the young Waorani and the beautiful farm next to her house. Sr. Rosita, you will always remain with us and in the memory of this people that you



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It was always a personal desire of mine to visit **the Capuchin Mission in Roca Fuerte**, on the border with Peru, belonging to the Vicariate of Aguarico, 4 hours from Coca by speedboat. The reason for my visit was to manage my visa at the border of Ecuador and Peru. This process of travel allowed me to meet **Fr. Teófilo, Fr. Manuel, Bro. Guzmán and Bro. Geovanni** in Roca Fuerte, who received me with warmth and hospitality. They were very beautiful days of sharing as a family and learning about their work at the Hospital Center, Yachana Inti School, and the pastoral work they do in other communities by waterway that included Pantoja in Peru (border with Ecuador). In addition, I had the opportunity to meet Srs. Capuchin Tertiaries.







In Peru I thank Catechist **Br. Walter** for receiving me and coordinating my accommodation in the **Tambo de Pantoja** where I met very kind people who guided me through my process. With the subject of my papers resolved, I returned to Dicaro and I will never stop telling this story of crossing to Pantoja and the beautiful landscapes that the Amazon gives you. I am fortunate to see it and as Pope Francis says in Querida Amazonia "... it is shown to the world in all its splendor, its drama, its mystery. God gave us the grace to have it..."

Thanks to the support of **the Jesuits**, the Waorani university students of Dicaro resume **English classes** with **Professor Christian**. It should be mentioned that their support was also essential for the English courses of the Salesian University of level 1, 2 and 3 where the group of 6th semester students were able to pass these mandatory levels. The same is expected of students in the 4th level group.

April 14 was the last farewell of **Fr. José Miguel Goldaraz "Achakaspi"**. It is not easy to find in life a person with as much wisdom and experience of mission as Fr. Achakaspi.



I was always very excited to arrive at the Vicariate of Aguarico and find him so willing to listen when we spoke to him about the work of REIBA in accompanying university students. Always very direct and at the same time questioning, his life left great admiration for his example of commitment to the poorest of the Amazon and the struggle for their defense. **Rest in peace with God dear Achakaspi!**

DREAMING OF A CHURCH WITH AN AMAZONIAN FACE

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EASTER

On **Sunday, April 13**, at the Tsimane Fatima Mission (Vicariate of REYES, Bolivia) we began Holy Week together with the blessing of palms and the celebration of the Word.







That day, after the celebration, the work plan was presented to the community from the socialization of the encyclical Querida Amazonia with the four dreams of Pope Francis. Each dream will have some activities that will be carried out from community education and school.



In this Jubilee Year, Pilgrims of Hope, we reflect on Jesus' Easter with the desire to pass from our old self to the new self and to allow ourselves to be purified by his love.

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We are grateful for the presence in these days Father Luis Fernando Rivero of the San Francisco de Borja Parish who accompanied all the celebrations together with the Tsimane ministers.

Intercongregational and Interministerial Experience in the Apostolic Vicariate of Reyes. With the arrival of **Sr. Patricia Botello**, a Mexican national, member of the Congregation of the Daughters of Immaculate Mary of Guadalupe and **Sr. Mildre Ureta**, Missionary of Mother Laura, we begin a new stage of pastoral life alongside the REIBA volunteers , **Alfonso Franco** from Colombia and **Nery Chamorro** from Paraguay.





"In 2022, a missionary experience began from CEAMA through REIBA, strengthening the presence of the Church in this indigenous community (Tsimane) from teamwork together with the missionaries and lay volunteers" (Source: Bolivian Episcopal Conference).



During the days of Easter (from **April 18 to 20**) we were visited by **Kristian Almblad** and **Lau Suensson**, European documentary filmmakers from Denmark's public television. They are making a documentary about the life and world of the Tsimane, where they also filmed scenes about the **spiritual life of the people during the celebration of the Easter Triduum.** This footage will be broadcast soon in that country. From **Aishalton (Guyana)** we share with you some photos of our **Palm Sunday** celebration as a community.



Final Round of **the Diocesan Bible Quiz**. This year, **Aishalton** had both a junior and senior team participating in the Annual Bible Quiz. This year's areas of study came from the Gospel of Luke, giving young people a great opportunity to immerse themselves in the gospel. On **April 13**, our 9 participants competed virtually, against other parishes in Guyana. And this year, we had two additional parishes from our Deep South region participating for the first time.







The quiz lasted about a month and a half, including 3 different rounds with study periods in between. In the end, our Junior team came in 3rd place and our Senior team got 4th place. It was a very enriching and fun experience where we all learned a lot!



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To commemorate **Holy Friday**, a group of young people from Saint Ignatius Parish and the surrounding villages carried out **the Stations of the Cross**. Each of the 14 stations was read as we climbed a steep trail that led to **the top of Shomberg's**







The ended stations at an intermediate point, where we proceeded to the Veneration the Cross, led by the young people and the leaders. It was a bit of a tiring day, complete with rain and sunshine, but a beautiful way to walk alongside and his Amazonian Jesus Church.

In **San Antonio de Lomerio (Bolivia)** every year twelve people are chosen, representing the twelve apostles. The community members elect 2 leaders per neighborhood, and currently San Antonio is made up of six neighborhoods. From Holy Thursday they take on the role of the disciples accompanying and presiding in all the religious celebrations that are lived, such as: the Last Supper, the taking down of our Lord for his holy burial, among many others.





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Another **Lomerian tradition** (from San Antonio de Lomerio, Bolivia) that takes place during Holy Week is to walk three times around the central square of the town with all the children and guards to protect the Sepulchre of the Lord. This moment is accompanied by native instruments typical of Holy Week.

Generally, it is the elderly who are in charge of playing these traditional instruments on these holy dates.

Holy Week in Dicaro (Ecuador). This was а different experience lived within the Waorani culture, where young people from studies, missionary higher children and adolescents, participated and organized all of the activities for these days special with the accompaniment of the Lauritas Sisters.





The climatic problems were not an obstacle to its success. On the contrary, every day more people came who wanted to live the meaning of the love, suffering and redemption of Jesus.







CENTRAL COORDINATION



April 3, Sr. Marbelis Monroy (general coordinator) met with Sr. Lisette Escárate (Volunteer Coordinator), Sr. Julia Trujillo (Coordinator of Management and Administration) and Ana Gabriela Jimenez (Coordinator of Communication/IBE) with the aim of coordinating the work plan for this current management team.

At the beginning of the meeting, they all briefly shared about the transition period occurring with the change of general coordination and then explained in detail what was planned for each commission for the next 3 months.

The general coordinator appreciates the accompaniment in this adaptation phase and motivates the team to continue working with the same effort as before.



On **Friday, April 4**, Sisters. Marbelis and Lisette visit **the REPAM Secretariat** in **Manaus**. It was a pleasant experience in which we shared about our common dreams in which we seek to respond to the needs of the beloved Amazon.





April 25, Sr. Marbelis Monroy, Sandra Robilliard (IBE REIBA advisor) and Ana Gabriela Jimenez, meet to plan the new accompaniment process that will be given to the REIBA Dicaro (university students) in order to have a better result in terms of the professional support that the expert can offer from her knowledge. They also had a conversation about the new reality of the Fátima Mission. There is interest on the part of a group of teachers outside the educational unit that the volunteers accompany, to also be trained in the AICLE methodology and in this way try to help cover the need that the Tsimán people have with Spanish. Currently, 90% are Tsimán/speakers, which also presents some challenges for young people or adults who wish to continue with higher education.



28 April, with the aim of continuing to accompany the REIBA lauretê mission – Brazil the coordinating team––Sr. Mariluce, Sr. Marbelis, Sr. Lisette and Ana Gabriela Jimenez–-met to discuss, consult and propose ideas for accompaniment based on the new context in the mission. In this mission, there are currently no REIBA volunteers (national or international). Sr. Mariluce was grateful for the discussion space and indicated that she will meet with the teachers of the San Miguel school and the principal to dialogue and see if they would agree with the proposal put forward by the REIBA organization.

THEMATIC TRAINING MEETINGS 2025 - ASESORÍA REIBA



1 April, the IBE Commission and the Volunteer Commission met with the coordinator of the local REIBA Kirigueti team, Sr. Arlette, and new REIBA volunteer, María Oliva. The team explained in greater detail the work which is to be carried out in the territory which aims to give continuity to the AICLE and Design of IBE Material projects that arose out of the 3rd round of EFTs.

On April 26th, Ana Gabriela on behalf of the IBE commission, together with the REIBA volunteers, Martha and Isabel from the REIBA Dicaro, had a brief exchange of ideas to analyze how to provide good accompaniment to Waorani university students, who need a lot of support in terms of learning Spanish in parallel to their university studies.

April 28, Ana Gabriela shares with Sandra Robilliard (IBE Advisor - REIBA and advisor of the EFT AICLE module) the concerns, desires and expectations of the REIBA Dicaro and the REIBA Misión Fátima. Ms. Sandra expressed the importance of accompanying Waorani students (REIBA Dicaro - Ecuador) with the teaching of Spanish and trying to adapt the classes as far as possible, to their context. She also expressed joy in knowing that there is a new group of teachers from Misión Fátima (REIBA Misión Fátima - Bolivia) who feel motivated to want to learn and implement AICLE with the Tsimán people.




COMMUNICATION COMMISSION

The next collaborative date is planned for May 22, the International Day for Biological Diversity.



"It is essential to pay special attention to Aboriginal communities with their cultural traditions. Indigenous people are not just a minority among others, but must become the main interlocutors, especially when it comes to advancing large projects that affect their spaces."

Thank you Pope Francis for your motivating words that move us to encounter the Amazonian face of the Church, thank you for your humanity, solidarity, joy and empathy with everyone, especially with the most vulnerable and forgotten.
